

MILLENNIUM MEMO

Last November I gave you a report on home sales for the 6 months ending Sept. 15, 2016, so I figured it might be time for an update. What's your guess? Are prices up or down? Well...I have some interesting data for you:

- 25 homes in The Tropics sold in the 12 months ending Sept. 15, 2017. The average sales price: \$164,014, an increase of 4.5% over last year. That sounds like only a modest increase, but...
- ...That average is misleading. One home sold for \$20K, but that was the only one under \$100K. 7 homes went for more than \$250K, which is the minimum you'd expect to pay for a new home in the Park.
- While prices are up, sales volume is down. My prior study included 20 sales over the 6 months for which I had data. Compare that with 25 homes selling over an entire year—only 9 of which sold in the past 6 months.

If we extrapolate the average sales price among The Tropics' 544 homes, your homes are collectively worth \$89,223,616. You're welcome!

In summary...the buyers of these homes are not just buying a 40 year old home-they're paying big money for the privilege of being your neighbors and enjoying the many protections of non-profit ownership. Or maybe it's just because Bingo is back.

Now, on a less-pleasant note...

Termites and Mice and Ants, Oh My!

Those are just some of the less desirable residents of The Tropics. In fact, let's add skunks & raccoons to the list of things to be expected when you're next to a creek.

There isn't much Management can do about this, it's just a fact of Tropics life. We're open to any ideas you may have, but in general, <u>you</u> are responsible for your own pest control—and for keeping your homes and skirting free of openings for these critters to enter.

I'm a Grandfather! My stepdaughter just had a beautiful (is there any other kind?) baby girl.

She loves her visits every other weekend from her daughter and granddaughter, Caitlin. Linda's mom is in an Alzheimer's Home in Santa Clara. She visits her every week and so does her brother. 


