MILLENNIUM MEMO

You did it! 100% of Tropics residents have returned their Annual Income Certifications. Thanks so much for your cooperation—and to Cathy for hunting down the last holdouts.

I'm probably more excited about that than you are. You might assume that it's easy to ask residents to honor the promises they made when we approved them to live in The Tropics, but there are always a few that need a gentle nudge—although Cathy's nudges sometimes aren't all that gentle!

Last year your Forms generated a property tax exemption totaling \$463,975.73, which paid for a big portion of the Capital Improvements you've been seeing. Here are just a few ways we've spent those dollars recently:

- **Street sealing--\$60K.**
- **Sidewalk repairs--\$25K.**
- **Trimming/removal of Palm Trees--\$46K.**

Isn't that a better use of your rent dollars than spending more on property taxes?

By the way...great as the streets look after being sealed, they'd be even better but for those residents who insisted on moving the barricades and driving over not-yet-dry areas. It's amazing, isn't it, how selfish some folks can be!

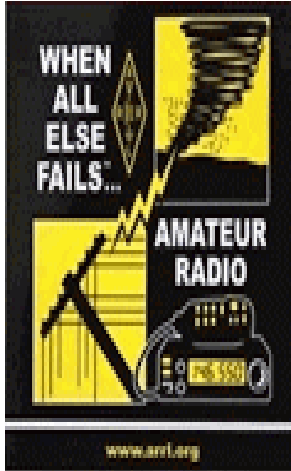

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

Extreme Weather Conditions



One of my many radio friends whom I talk to frequently lives in Port Lucie, Florida. We are all on the same page regarding the changing of seasons and its effect on weather. Safety in our community is shared by all ham stations throughout this vast country. In the event of any major disaster all stations activate immediately and report activity from the affected areas.

Most of us have auxiliary power sources; we do not depend on the grid which could fail at any time. The usual methods for emergency power is a generator, solar cell or wind powered; with battery backup. In all cases this is sometimes hours before the major news media arrives to give their limited perspective. When trees and power lines are down or floods make it impossible to travel our team is already in place to provide vital information directly from ground zero. The media can be at only one site at a time; however nearly one million amateur radio operators can cover a much greater area with reports directly at the scene.



We are a major provider of accurate information regarding effects of hurricanes, tornados, earthquakes, flooding, fires and many other unforeseen disasters.

Maritime traffic is another one of the many activities we monitor closely. Any ship or aircraft putting out a distress call comes up quickly on our frequency scanner. We have assisted the Coast Guard, aircraft and frequently talk to the astronauts in outer space.

Having a little extra time on her hands while in Hawaii she earned two college degrees. One in Computer Business Administration and another in Tourism and Hospitality.

Born in a one stop light town in the thumb of Michigan called "Marlette, Michigan". Quite a few mobile homes here in the park have the word "Marlette" on them. Those were built in her hometown. She has 3 sisters and 1 brother, lots of nieces and nephews. Tina says, we are spread out all over the United States and Canada. Our parents get to visit so many locations around North America just visiting their children and grandchildren. Tina has traveled from the East coast all the way to Hawaii; this is over 5 different time zones.

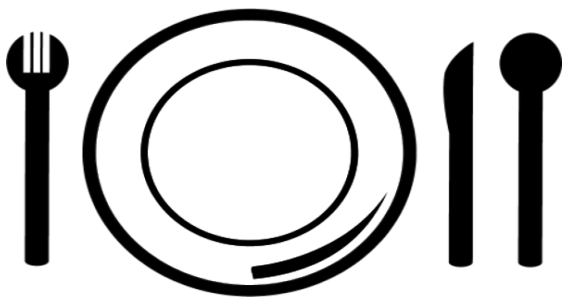

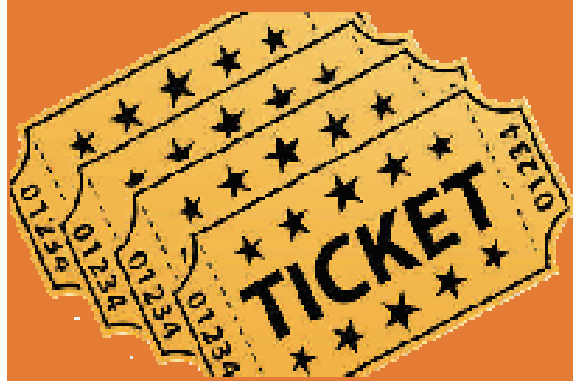

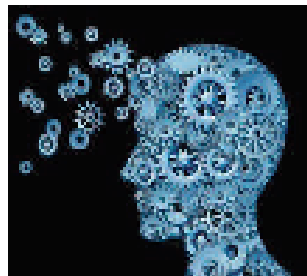
