You read my comments last month about high Tropics' home prices and, being a financially savvy sort, you checked your insurance policy. To your horror, you realize your insurance coverage has not kept pace with rising home values. So...do you need more insurance?

Maybe not. When you review your coverage's, don't just have your agent look at sales prices. What matters is your home's replacement cost, which isn't the same thing—something a lot of Santa Rosa residents are about to find out.

When someone buys a home in our fair Park, that person isn't just paying for the home itself. A big part of the sales price is a premium for the right to live in a rent-protected, well-maintained, non-profit-owned Community. That same home in a different park might be worth a lot less—but the cost to replace it would be the same.

You're already a member of the Millennium Family, so that part of your home value doesn't have to be insured against. When you talk to your agent, have him/her focus on your potential loss, not what your home would sell for...and make sure your agent explains the difference between Actual Cash Value and Replacement Cost coverage.

Now the obligatory disclaimer: I'm not an insurance agent and I'm not giving insurance advice, just throwing out food for thought. As you may remember from a past Memo, I'm the guy who once bought a "Fire & Theft" policy—the kind that only pays if my home is robbed while it's on fire. Shows what I know!


