The year also saw Rosie Friedland leave SPARC in order to spend time with her parents, who were both in poor health (her mother has since left us). However, we are pleased to introduce Stacee Price as Rosie Friedland's successor at SPARC. Stacee will do a great job for you. If needed, Nicki Ross, Rosie's old boss, is available to help Stacee with the transition.

Stacee has experience in teaching, headed the Habitat for Humanity chapter at UC Riverside and has already had success bringing resources to a couple of our Parks. We're very excited to welcome Stacee into the SPARC/Millennium Family.





EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION INFORMATION

Safety in our Park.



Amateur Radio operators set up and operate organized communication networks locally for governmental and emergency officials, as well as non-commercial communication for private citizens affected by the disaster. Amateur Radio operators are most likely to be active after disasters that damage regular lines of communications due to power outages and destruction of telephone, cellular and other dependent systems. Many radio amateurs are active as communications volunteers with local public safety organizations. In addition, in some disasters, radio frequencies are not coordinated among relief officials and Amateur Radio operators step in to coordinate communication when radio towers and other elements in

the communications infrastructure are damaged.

Amateur Radio operators have informal and formal groups to coordinate communication during emergencies. Amateur Radio operators may participate in local emergency organizations, or organize world wide "traffic nets" using VHF (very high frequencies) and UHF (ultra high frequencies). At the state level, Amateur Radio operators are often involved with state emergency management operations. In addition, Amateur Radio operators communicate at the national level through the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency

Service (RACES), which is coordinated through the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and through the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES), which is coordinated through the American Radio Relay League and its field volunteers. Many Amateur Radio operators are also involved in Skywarn, operating under the National Weather Service and provide emergency weather information to the NWS for analysis and dissemination to the public. KK6KSY are involved in California Rescue Communications, RACES, ARES and the Western Public Service System to name a few of the 27 traffic nets we are involved in daily. Be prepared and support your amateur radio operators who are constantly monitoring for your safety.
