Your Reward for Conserving Water...

...is a 25% increase in water rates, according to a notice from the Alameda County Water District. The District will take action on this at its Feb. 9 Meeting. The new charges go into effect March 1, with an additional 5% increase in 2018.

We don't like this either but I'm just the messenger. You can comment on this at www.acwd.org/rateproposal by Feb. 9. They claim they'd love to hear from you.

Per the Notice, water charges for the average residential customer will increase by \$11.94/month, or \$23.87 per bi-monthly bill. The reason for the increase: "to address the significant revenue loss as a result of the drought." Translation: your conservation efforts cost the District money. They hate it when that happens.

We've gotten lots of rain this year, so surely rates will go back down when the drought is over, won't they? Yeah—I'm holding my breath too.


Getting to know your Neighbor—Alva McLain

Alva retired from working 41 years at the Federal Reserve of San Francisco. Her hobbies include reading, gardening, crafts.





Advisory: Weather Alert—Being Prepared!

After nearly eight years of drought we are approaching a normal water table here in the Bay Area. Last month there was heavy rain fall overflowing levies resulting in flooding. Your safety is dependent upon good responsible planning. Listed below is a check off list which will

prepare you for extreme weather conditions around your home:

- Make sure your cell phone is charged
- Freeze plastic containers filled with water to make blocks of ice that can be placed in your refrigerator and freezer during an outage to prevent food from spoiling
- Pick up loose leaves before the storm to reduce risk of street flooding;
 monitor grates to keep water flowing
- Prepare a simple emergency kit: a flashlight, battery-operated clock, extra batteries, manual can opener, supply of bottled water
- During an outage, use battery-operated flashlights, and not candles, due to the risk of fire. If you must use candles, keep them away from drapes, lampshades and small children. Do not leave candles unattended
- Have a battery-operated radio or television to get news reports with estimated times that electricity will be restored in case of power outage.
- Assume any downed line is "energized" and stay away. Do not remove fallen tree limbs or other debris from lines
- Refrain from removing manhole covers to relieve flooding on streets and intersections
- Have a list of all contact information for local emergencies such as contacting PG&E for power outages.

If you need sandbags to prepare for flooding around your home, Public Works has sandbags available for Union City residents and businesses. They're at the visitor parking area outside of the Public Works Maintenance Facility; located at 34650

7th Street, Union City.

Prepare for the storms be proactive and not a victim. We are all responsible for ourselves!


