MILLENNIUM MEMO

It's the end of another bond year, the time to close the books and see how we did. What's your guess? Did The Tropics fare better or worse than last year?

The short answer: A little better. This year's surplus totaled \$610,202, compared with \$588,689 in the 2016 Bond Year—and that's after spending \$110K more on landscaping, mainly trees, and \$41K more on the Patrol Service. Not a bad year.

After prepaying next year's bond fees and various required deposits, we're left with \$445K. That would go a long way toward enhancing your Park, wouldn't it? Alas, no-hence my annual gripe at the City.

The City makes us send 50% of all surpluses-\$222,500 in this case-to the Rental Assistance Fund. We'd rather spend that money on making your Park nicer or on more Patrols or trimming more trees—particularly given that the Rent Fund has 300% of the amount needed for the Program.

That's OK—let's celebrate another strong year for The Tropics and make do with the \$222.5K the City is allowing the Park to keep.

you want to make renovations to the rooms inside your home. Draw a plot of your desired changes and when approved, it will be placed in your file.

Just a reminder that weeds are growing like crazy and if we are not <u>proactive</u>, they will get out of control. The landscaping at all homes should be maintained on a regular basis. Maintenance has installed some new solar LED lamps on the south pathways where there were dark areas and at the RV storage areas.

The Food Bank has been well attended and we want to especially thank the volunteers who assist us on Fridays. Remember, the first and third Friday of each month at 10:30 a.m.


