#### **MILLENNIUM MEMO**

We had a great meeting with your newly-elected Board on August 11. Topics included a discussion of the Budget for the new Fiscal Year, an update on various projects, the new Patrol Service and the status of a potential refinance (short answer: we're still at an impasse).

Some highlights of the meeting:

- Our Tree Consultant surprised us with the news that 140+ Palm Trees on residents' lots needed to be trimmed soon, at a cost of \$42K. Several trees in the common areas have become hazardous because of the drought and should be removed--that's another \$10K. Just like that: \$52K that wasn't anticipated. We have to do it, of course.
- Most Park owners would charge homeowners to trim trees on their spaces, as is allowed under the Mobile home Residency Law, but we aren't going to do that.
- Another surprise: the sudden deterioration of the Spa. We'll spend about \$14K replastering and adding hand rails & depth markers. Yet another hit to the Budget!
- The new Patrol Service's insurer killed the idea of patrolling the walkways in Golf Carts. They will patrol on foot, however. The patrolmen will have to "check in" with sensors to be added to the walkways, so we'll know that they actually patrolled.
- The Board asked us to bring back the Clubhouse Monitor, so we'll do that. By the way, we're still trying to get another maintenance person to help Jim. If you know of anyone, Jim would love to hear from you.
- Yes, the Patrol Service will ticket improperly parked cars. If you get 4 tickets, you'll be towed the 5<sup>th</sup> time. That's fair, isn't it? Do you really need 4 warnings?
- If you attended the Aug. 11 General Meeting, you probably heard a presentation from the folks that say they can fix the Clubhouse sound problem, something that might cost as much as \$160K. We'd love to get that done this fiscal year.

I hope these tidbits give you a flavor for how the meeting went. The new Board seems focused and eager to make its impact felt. We are excited to work with them—and with you, of course—to make The Tropics an even greater housing value than it already is.





#### **Another Life Saved**



The amateur radio frequencies are used for communicating reports that are emergency related. I have been involved with relays for catastrophic lifesaving disasters; it has been a very rewarding experience.

Several months ago I received a call on the radio requesting help for a tragic automobile accident in a remote part of our state. There wasn't a cell tower nearby. Their cell phones wouldn't work. One of our ham radio mobile stations in a car put out an emergency call. I had the highway patrol, ambulance, fire trucks and a helicopter there within minutes.

This week another frantic call came from a ham who was camping in the wilderness. His neighbor in the campground sud-

denly suffered a massive heart attack; it was quickly followed by a stroke. As usual in this case he was unable to contact any emergency services because cell phone

service wasn't available in his location. Nine of us picked up his distress call all the way from Washington State to California. We immediately contacted emergency services; while he was still transmitting there was a helicopter, ambulance and paramedics all arriving within minutes. As a result the patient was stabilized and on the way to the hospital by air flight. Because we do not use the grid or cell towers our signal works directly station to station with speed of light performance.



Thanks to Mr. George Turk we here in The Tropics are privilege to have this capability. No one can predict what could happen one minute from now.

We recently assisted the police department when a powerful signal disabled their patrol cars, cell phones, radios as well as the fobs to unlock the door. We combined a team to resolve the problem. Most of the amateur operators have been in the hobby all their life. This requires long time knowledge and expert electrical en-

gineers who not only design but build state of the art radios. We're a major support for the military and all emergency services. The Federal Communications Commission has designated all amateur transmitters to be emergency stations.




