The many members of emergency communications frequently meet at rallies as well as ham fests. They are from around the world. We all have one thing in common. It is the protection of our communities as well as preparedness in the event of major catastrophes. Once a ham you are never a stranger. We are all part of a life-time family.

Different regions have special types of needs. For example some have hurricanes, others have frequent earthquakes; and then there are the tsunamis' which travel up to 500 miles per hour. We are all familiar with the devastating yearly tornados in a large section of our country; it's commonly known as tornado alley. Recently there has been contaminated drinking water distributed by the City of Flint Michigan.

The amateur radio community has in many cases monitored calls from these desperate areas and relayed the urgent messages hours before the news media receives it. This morning a ham radio operator called the U.S Coast Guard to alert them of a major oil spill at sea. The Coast Guard was able to contain the affected area. All of the amateur radio community knew about it immediately. We have ridden in police cars, fire trucks and ambulances providing relayed messages. When those communication services failed.

The Tropics Mobile Home Park is known and well represented around the world.

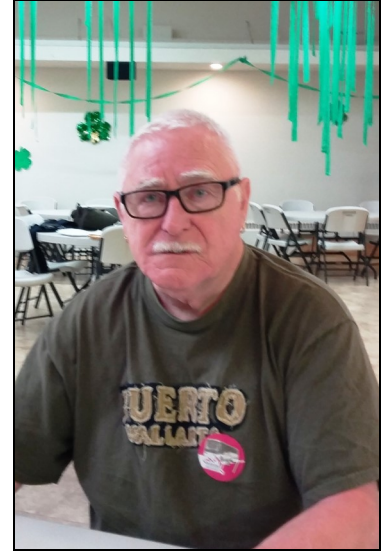
