Who is this SPARC you ask, what does it do and why do you keep hearing this acronym? I'm glad you asked! SPARC, Inc. is Millennium Housing's residential services partner. SPARC stands for <u>Services and Programs Assisting Residents in Our Com-</u> munities.

We hope you've taken advantage of some of the programs SPARC has brought to your clubhouse, such as the Tri-City Mobile Health Clinic, Food Pantry, Spectrum Lunches, Live2bHealthy Exercise Programs, Informational Seminars and Resource Fairs. SPARC's costs—including my salary!—are funded by grants from Millennium Housing.

I have to say, planning programs for Tropics residents is a real treat thanks to the wonderful cooperation of the Residents Club members and a number of helpful residents. Many of the events SPARC puts on are the results of a brilliant collaboration. As Fall approaches, here are some new ideas we're pursuing:

Balance and Fall Prevention Classes: SPARC hopes to partner with various Health providers to bring an 8-week stabilization class to The Tropics. The goal: to strengthen the body and reduce the chances of falling.

<u>Learning Opportunities</u>: SPARC is talking to local organizations and colleges to bring a fall series of courses that could range from cooking, art, exercise, selfdefense and music. More information will be available in September.

<u>Continuing the Tri-City Mobile Health Clinic</u>: Don't forget to sign up in the office for any upcoming appointments you would like to have in the Mobile Health Clinic. They are scheduled to come every Thursday from 9AM-12 Noon in front of the clubhouse!

SPARC is working on several other collaborations with local organizations that I'd love to tell you about, but we aren't quite ready to make any formal announcements yet. Stay Tuned!




