AT&T is upgrading the current copper lines across the nation (apparently copper will be switched off at some point so they have to upgrade) to fiber optics however the current underground ducting is so impacted they have to lay a new duct line to pull the fiber optics through along Waikiki and Hawaii Circle where they have legal easement rights.

The summary of work to be done on this project is as follows.

- AT&T will start within the next 8 weeks
- AT&T will notify residents in the affected area 72 hours prior to work
- New line will be run by boring underground with proper USA call out prior
- Three to five 4'x4' pits will be dug on either side of the manholes on street to bore through
- Streets/landscaping or any other area disturbed will be returned to like or better condition after project
- West Valley or Irish Construction will be the contractor for AT&T and are fully insured/bonded and licensed (I'm asking for certificate of insurance)
- Project will take 1 to 2 weeks from start to finish



MILLENNIUM MEMO

The Tropics had another healthy surplus in 2016: \$588,889, net of required reserves. That's up from \$512,910 in 2015 despite spending \$50K more on Landscaping and \$20K more on the Patrol Service. Where does all that money go? Here's where:

Prepay 2017's Bond Fees--\$65,949.

Required deposit to the Capital Improvement Fund--\$32,096, and...wait for it... City-mandated payment into the Housing Assistance Fund--\$490,644!

Regarding that last item...a few years ago the City advanced \$1,600,000 in Redevelopment money to the Tropics Housing Assistance Fund. For the City, it was either that or give that money back to the State. We agreed to put all surpluses into the Assistance Fund until the \$1.6M was "paid back." After this year's payment, we only have about \$69K left to repay.

The current balance in the Fund is \$1.3M—and growing. We'd love to use some of that money for more capital improvements but our deal with the City doesn't allow it. Oh, well!

SPARC in The Tropics

Considering the big rains, the Bright & Prepared Future Seminar was a success. 40 of you joined Stacee Price (she's with SPARC, our resident services partner) to hear speakers from Live2bHealthy (fall prevention), CRIL (discussing exciting new technologies), Tri-City Health (re: their new programs) & Tri-City Cremation, who prompted us to think outside the box.

Kudos to Richard Stoll for making that fabulous homemade soup, ably assisted by Stacee, of course. Everyone had a great time and got a chance to think about their futures...which brings to mind Yogi Berra's famous line: "Our whole future is ahead of us."

TROPICS MOBILE HOME PARK SWIMMING POOL GUIDELINES Effective February 1, 2017

Pool opens April1st and closes December 31st. The Spa is open all year around. Cooperation is essential if the pool and the recreation area are to operate for the maximum fun and safety for the greater number of people. With this thought in mind, the following specific rules are deemed necessary. Please familiarize yourself with them.

- Pool hours are as posted. (9 AM 9:30 PM) Swimming hours for anyone 18 years or under (accompanied by an adult resident) are as follows: Monday thru Saturday 9 a.m. until 3 p.m., Sunday and holiday hours are unrestricted. A park resident must accompany all guests. Each household is allowed four guests at one time if pool capacity will allow.
- It is advised that no one uses the swimming pool, spa, or saunas alone. Anyone using these facilities does so at his/her own risk. People with heart conditions or respiratory ailments should consult their physician before using the sauna or spa.
- No diapers allowed at any time. Exception: Swimmers (disposable diapers for pool use.)
- Any undue splashing and cannon balls in the pool will not be allowed. Running, horseplay, or unnecessary noise will not be tolerated. No flippers, inner-tubes, rafts, snorkels, etc. will be allowed in the pool. Exception: Noodles, water wings & small safety tubes or rings.
- You must shower or bathe before entering pool or spa. (State law).
- No cut offs or street clothes permitted as swim attire. Tank tops and/or T-shirts are acceptable attire, (white only). Please remove all bobby pins and hair ornaments before entering pool.
- All persons using the showers, spa, pool, are prohibited from exiting pool area through clubhouse in swim attire.
- No glassware of any type is permitted in the pool or deck area.
- No smoking allowed in or around pool area (except in designated area)
- Please place towels over the patio furniture when using sun-tanning oils.
- There will be no alcoholic beverages in the pool area, dressing room, or clubhouse. Any person exhibiting an intoxicated condition will be asked to leave the area.
- No eating permitted in or around deck area of pool (except in designated area) Snack foods only.
- The management and/or pool monitors reserve the right to ask anyone to leave the pool area. No verbal or physical abuse towards Management and/or pool monitors will be tolerated, and will result in pool privileges being revoked for Resident and/or guest.


This remarkable lady is an avid sports fan. She has seen all the famous players and can name
