MILLENNIUM MEMO

“Whenever I think of the past, it brings back so many memories.” Steven Wright.

2016 turned out to be a pretty good year in The Tropics. Here are just a few of my favorite highlights:

The year got off to a great start: Nancy Payne & Jim Woock were named Bessire & Casenhiser Managers of the Year!

We’ll end up spending about \$500K on Park Upgrades by the end of the year. Big ticket items included sound abatement in the Main Hall (\$163K), Pool Landscaping (\$112K), Lighting (\$50K last month alone), Street Slurry (\$60K)...you get the idea.

New homes keep coming into the Park—and selling for very high prices! Why wouldn’t they, given the prime location, VERY affordable rents (for the East Bay), continuing Park improvements and the chance to live among you fine folks?

The Tropics kept its “A+” bond rating. OK, that’s more exciting to me than it is to you, but it’s a sign of how highly the financial community values your Community.

We upgraded the Patrol Service, raising the Patrol budget by 500%, to pay for additional patrols. We’ll see if we do, in fact, get what we pay for.

We completed the transition to the new billing system, which lets you pay your rent online. It was a challenge but Nancy & Co. got it done.

Stacey Price settled in as the new Regional Manager for SPARC, our resident services partner. SPARC had another banner year in The Tropics. Some examples: 2 Resource Fairs, Live 2B Healthy Exercise Class, Wellness Classes, Scam Stoppers Dinner, Spring Fling Clothing Drive...I can’t wait to see what Stacey comes up with in 2017.

Some things haven’t changed. A few folks still drive too fast, don’t pick up after their dogs—and too many of said dogs love hearing themselves bark. I think you’ll agree, however, that The Tropics had a great year.

In Other News...

- **At the Board’s request, Children’s Pool Hours will now be 9AM-3PM, Mon-Sat. Let’s see how that works out.**

- We also agreed to heat the Pool from April-Dec, 3 months longer than before on a trial basis. If the Pool isn't used much in extra months, we'll go back to the old schedule.
- On a sadder note: Jim Woock has resigned his position and moved to Oregon. Good for Jim, not so much for us. We'll miss Jim's humor, work ethic and devotion to the Park. Jim will be a tough act to follow!

Getting to Know your Neighbors...who lived in Honolulu, Hawaii On December 7, 1941

There are many residents current as well as former who live in the Tropics, who were living in Hawaii at the time of the Japanese sneak attack on Pearl Harbor 75 years ago. These are actual accounts of those who were there at ground zero: Dec. 7th 1941. It's a day that has and always will live in infamy.

At 7:13 am the peaceful laid back community of Honolulu, Hawaii was awakened by the loud roar of Japanese bombers approaching at full throttle. My father (who lived here in The Tropics in the early 80's for several years), was assigned to the Battle Ship USS Arizona which was one of the first vessels to be attacked. He was among the few fortunate survivors who now at 95 is grateful to still be alive. As the ships were sunk Raymond Salsedo, an underwater diver and welder specialist, went down torching escape holes and rescued 50 sailors. This is a true patriotic American hero!!! He has been contacted by the

current base commander at Pearl Harbor and received a round trip ticket to appear at the 75th memorial ceremony. There is going to be a special presentation recognizing him for his outstanding 39 year service to the US Navy. On Veterans Day my dad sent his best wishes on ham radio and thanked all who have answered the call to serve their country proudly. This was broadcasted on the USS Hornet Aircraft Carrier Amateur net all over the world. Bravo Ben net controller .

Patricia Rodrigues called our Breeze Editor to tell her story of the day she was born. Queen's Hospital record shows she was born at 8am on December 7, 1941. She tells of how neighbors had taken her mom to the hospital in the early morning hours. Her father would follow after. He told Pat in later years, he had to run through the streets to the hospital, stopping to lie down and hide as the bombs were dropping around him, then get up again and start running. To her mother's relief her father did finally make it to the hospital in time.

Patricia is one of 7 babies that were born during the black out. The hospital staff could hear the bombs dropping around the area as her mother was given birth to Patricia.

Pat and her family later moved to the mainland in 1959.

She has danced hula all over the islands winning awards! She was invited to Tahiti to dance in a competition for Tahitian Dance and won 1st place. She has 3 brothers and a sister. They were all born in Hawaii. At the time of her retirement she had been working 2 jobs; both were assembly line work in factories. Patricia moved into the park in 1996.

October 6, 2016

The meeting was called to order by President Richard Stoll at 7:00 p.m. All Board members were present except Barry Lependorf who was excused. There were 5 guests including Karen Schrum from Bessire & Casenhiser, Inc.

- **Update on Projects:** Karen Schrum gave the Board updates on current projects in the Park. They included: palm tree removal, heating of the pool year-round, kids hours in the pool, clubhouse sound abatement, walkway lighting, and skylight. Two candidates for event monitor, Anita and Michael, were present.
- **Guest Speaker:** Anita Roque spoke about the rules on renting rooms in the Park.
- **Minutes:** The minutes of the last Board meeting were approved unanimously.
- **The Financial Report, Bingo Report and the Travelers' Report** were all read and approved unanimously. The Auditor's Report will be given at a later date.
- **Correspondence and e-mails:** Were read by the Secretary.
- **Carolyn Gielow** gave a report on the Neighborhood Watch. A motion was passed that the Neighborhood Watch would proceed without the Board's involvement.
- **Old Business:** It was agreed to give each candidate 3 minutes for a presentation and 3 minutes for answering questions.

- **Several suggestions on changing the by-laws** were presented. The Secretary will send these to the By-Law Committee.

Christmas dinners will be delivered to shut-ins in the Park. A motion to give \$1000 from the Bingo Charity Fund to the Fire Department's Toys for Tots Program was passed.
 - **Upcoming Events:** Pot Luck, October 2; Breakfast, October 8; Resource Fair, October 15; Halloween Event, October 22. The meeting was adjourned at 8:29 p.m.
