That doesn't jibe with what I've been reading about Bay Area housing costs—or with the high home values in The Tropics, where only one home has sold for less than \$100K in the past 6 months and several have gone for \$200K+. Potential home buyers seem to think our rents are a bargain—and they would know the market, wouldn't you think?

If you are among the 28% of Tropics residents receiving Housing Assistance, your assistance will be increased to cover this \$22. If you're truly struggling with this \$22 increase, you can apply at the Office to get on the Program. We still have room to add a few folks.

Even if you don't qualify for assistance, you can take comfort in the fact that Tropics rents would be 2 or 3 times higher if it hadn't converted to non-profit ownership 17 years ago.






CERAMICS CLUB




