MILLENNIUM MEMO

I happened to be in Union City last month for the annual State of the City Luncheon. It was a chance to discuss The Tropics with our Elected Officials and hear them brag about the good job they are doing.

You'll be happy to know that the City's finances are stronger than in recent years. The City reported a \$2.8M surplus, higher reserves and has enough money to start paying down the deficit in the Employee Retirement Fund. It sounds as if the City is doing almost as well as The Tropics.

The highlight of my visit, however, was seeing our beautiful new streets. Don't you just love new streets? I can't think of any other improvement that makes as much of an impact. We spent \$855K of your rent dollars, but wasn't that worth it?

Next up: a complete \$122K makeover of the Pool Area, which may have started by the time you read this. We've also just finished clearing our side of the Creek bed, something we've wanted to do for at least 15 years.

Whenever I talk about spending big money, you know I have to bring up the Annual Income Certifications, the source of much of the funding for these exciting projects. On that score, I can now report that we have Certs from 100% of Tropics households, a great achievement, for which we thank you. Your Park is that much better because of your cooperation.

Did You Put It In Writing?

You see a certain resident speeding or someone violating an important rule or an area of the Park that needs attention or (insert name of complaint here)...our first question will always be: Did you put it in writing—and in a timely manner?

If you Put It In Writing, we have a record of how many times a resident has violated the rule, what specific action you'd like to see, what action Management has taken, whether this is a common problem and, if we have to go to court, we have support for our action.

On the other hand, if a resident won't take the time to fill out a Complaint/Suggestion Form, well, that complaint couldn't have been very important, could it?

You'll find an excellent description of our Complaint Policy and a copy of the Form on the excellent Tropics Wind website. You can also get a copy at the Office or on our website. It's an easy process, you'll feel better for acting and it helps us monitor our Staff's response time.

Have You Tried Our Exercise Classes?

The Park is sponsoring a 30-day trial of a fun exercise class. We'd like to extend the trial, but only if enough of you participate. Why not come by and check it out?

Enjoy the new streets, thank you for your Income Certs, Put It In Writing, give our Exercise Class a try,...and have a Merry Christmas.

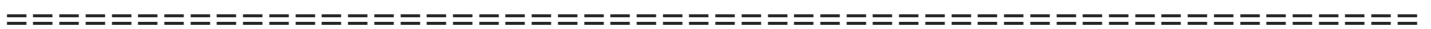
EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS INFORMATION



An earthquake on the border of Fremont and Union City occurred at the Hayward Fault. This epicenter was at a spot just north of the intersection of Niles Canyon Road and Mission Boulevard. Damage from the quake was minimal, scientists warn that a much larger one is expected on the Hayward Fault, which extends from San Pablo Bay in the north to Fremont in the south and passes through heavily populated areas including Berkeley, Oakland, Hayward, Union City and Fremont. The last big earthquake on the fault was estimated to have a 6.8-magnitude. According to the USGS it occurred in 1868 with a loss of 30 lives. “The population is now 100 times bigger in the East Bay, so we have many more people that will be impacted,” said Tom Brocher, a research geophysicist with the USGS. Be prepared and support your amateur radio operators who are constantly monitoring for your safety.

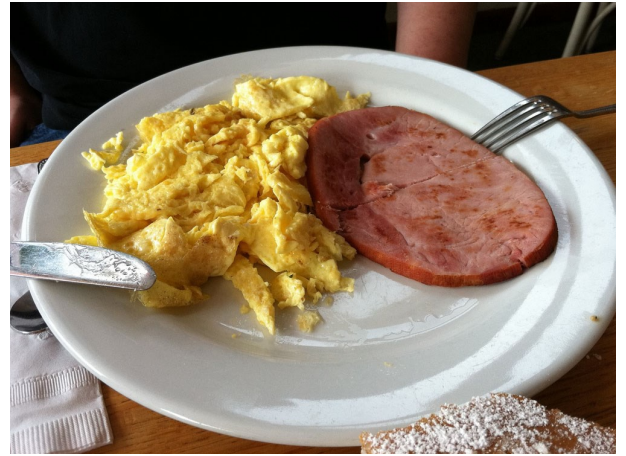

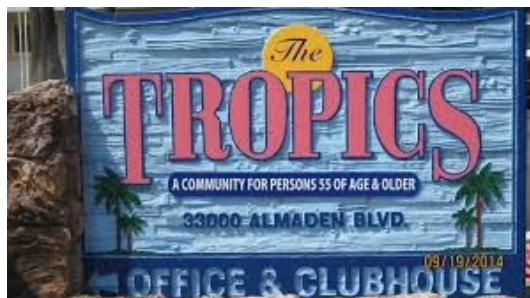
