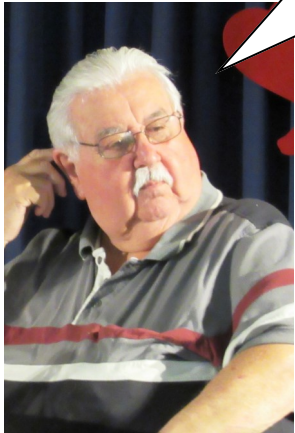

MILLENNIUM MEMO

“It’s clearly a budget. It’s got a lot of numbers in it.” Attributed to George W. Bush

The proposed 2016/2017 Tropics’ budget does, in fact, have a lot of numbers—many reflecting input from the Residents Club Board, our partner in this process.

We prepare a draft budget projecting day-to-day needs and suggestions from Management. This year, for instance, the draft budget included such necessary-but-boring things as a new water backflow device (\$23K), sidewalk repairs (\$25K), another golf cart (\$4K)—that sort of thing. We also included \$20K for the new Entrance Sign we hope to do someday.

With the initial draft as a starting point, we then ask for Board input for the “fun stuff.” Here are some Board suggestions that made it into the final version:

- Patrol Service Cost will increase from last year’s \$16K to \$82K, a 500% jump. The plan is for someone to patrol continuously from 9 PM-6 AM every night.
- Landscaping cost will nearly double—from \$58K to \$112K--reflecting a request for enhanced weed control and ivy cutback.

New Capital Projects: a retaining wall along the Canal (\$70K); additional lighting on the Walkways (at locations suggested by Board Members), Main Hall & Conference Room (\$50K); 2 radar speed signs (\$16K); new pool furniture (\$10K); and sound baffling in the Main Hall, so you can hear me at resident meetings.

That last item is, well, baffling. It could cost as much as \$160,000 depending on which proposal is chosen. Before we spend that kind of money and make that significant of a change to the Hall, we’ll solicit LOTS of input—perhaps even have a vote on the final design.

If you’re keeping score at home, that’s \$435,000 in capital projects (assuming we do the sound baffling) plus \$120,000 more in operating expenses. Your Rent Dollars at Work!

In Other News...

The \$15K in additional sidewalk repairs I mentioned last month turned out to be \$22K worth, as we found a few more areas where we could improve safety.

This month’s Resident Kudos go to Beatrice Bartz (Sp. 493) & Christine Van Remoortel (Sp. 336) for their great volunteer work with the Spectrum Lunches. Beatrice & Christine make sure everyone is served, then stay to clean up afterwards. Thanks so much Beatrice & Christine!

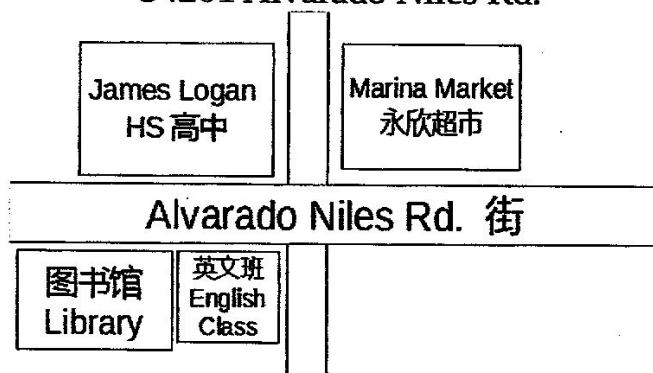

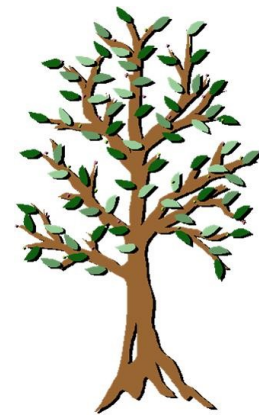

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS



Can you believe we're half way through the summer already? Our heaters are on break and the air conditioners are humming away. Living in California with its beautiful four seasons usually has a pleasant transition from one to the other. We're all grateful for the year around mild temperatures here.

I wish everyone has an enjoyable summer. Please do not be complacent about our high vulnerability for earthquakes as well as tsunamis that will follow. Last month I heard on the emergency net there was a 5.3 tremor in southern California. The important issue here is to be prepared!

Tina and I are on the amateur bands at 6 am every day; we're in constant contact with weather as well as earthquake conditions. We travel frequently to conventions where everyone shares vital information regarding their locations.

Last month a simulated earthquake along with a tsunami practice alert was held. Remember the tidal waves, triggered by earthquakes can be 100 feet high and travel at 500 miles per hour. Union City is 28 feet above sea level.

If you would like to monitor the conditions as they are happening contact me and I'll tell you how to obtain an amateur band radio receiver. You may use one of these devices to listen for activity coming out of the affective area as well as enjoy hearing other communities discussing friendly conversations around the world. This includes tornados, floods, tsunamis and volcanoes.

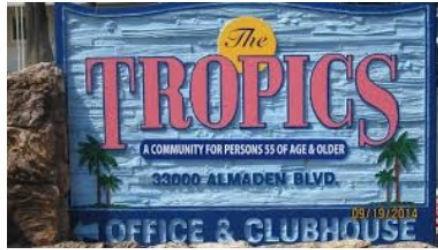

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR-BEA BARTZ

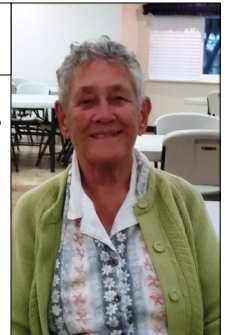
