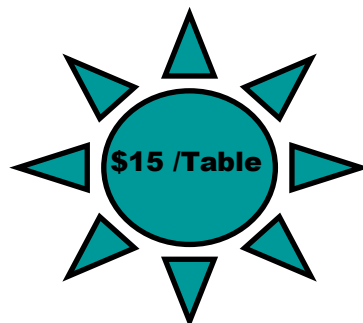

**APRIL 5, 2018**

### **RE: Board Meeting from March 1, 2018**

- Meeting called to order by President Richard Stoll at 6:59 pm.
- Roll was taken; all board members were present except Carolyn Hoppes, excused.
- Guest speakers: Larry Cornell, Re: February's Bingo Summary Sheet. Dinner menu brought up from Chinese New Year Menu. Jerry Aguila, Re: Free rent drawing for this year's N.Y.E. party. Larry Cornell Re: How the board approves different subjects and how the general public (residents) can make a motion during the meetings. Ernie Odi-amer, Re: Car wash area and Maintenance area.
- Minutes were read from Board Meeting from February 1, 2018, Approved.
- Treasures Report: Rick read all reports, and were Approved. Richard read Bingo reports and will correct summary from February. Not accepted until corrected.
- Tropics Travelers: Reports read, report was approved by 4 members, 1 nay. Report was not understood by a member; this was explained and then was approved.
- Audit Committee: Report read by Rick Henry for November 2017, December 2017 and January 2018. The audit committee found a discrepancy from the Bingo for Marathon Dist. and Game Night Event.
