A Veteran of Two Wars - Dorothy Marshall (Holtzberg)

WORLD WAR II

Shortly after finishing her training to become a Registered Nurse she was accepted into the NAVY NURSE CORP (NNC). She was stationed at the U.S. Naval Hospital (Mare Island, Vallejo, CA) for about two years – mostly serving on the amputee wards caring for Marines.

On 1/29/46 she was transferred to the MILITARY SEA TRANSPORT SERVICE (MSTS) for duty with medical teams on ships that transferred troops, government workers, and dependents on runs from San Francisco to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. A round trip took 12 to 14 days depending on the weather.

On 6/26/46 at the war's end she was discharged from the Navy as a Lt.Jg.

KOREAN WAR

On 2/25/51, she was recalled back into the NNC to the Oaknoll Naval Hospital in Oakland.CA. working mostly on orthopedic wards and training corpsmen to become medics with the Fleet Marines in the South Pacific.

On 8/21/51 she was again sent to MSTS ships making runs from Seattle, WA to Yokohama, Japan carrying the same type of passengers as WWII. Many trips were made over a 20 month period. Each round trip took about 26 days. The sights and experiences of Japan were tremendous.

On 5/14/54 at the war's end she was discharged from the NNC as a Lt., thus ending her Navy career.

She is a Charter Member of the Memorial for Women in the Military, in Washington DC.

She and her husband moved into the Tropics in 1984. He passed away in 2005

Meeting adjourned at 8:12 pm by Ken Mainville and seconded by Mona Jhaveri.



DISASTER COMMITTEE NEWS

As I was thinking about what to write this month it occurred to me some Residents may not know why our walk-talkie (or 2 way radios) checks were set-up for use in a major disaster. When messages are sent to Home Base by block captains those messages are monitored by our Tropics ham operator(s). If he/she hears a house(s) is on fire, a radio call can immediately be made to the City's central command post. Only they can dispatch fire trucks, police, ambulances, etc. We are fortunate here in the Tropics to have a ham radio set-up and several licensed ham radio operators. Perhaps now that we know the vital role block captains play for our safety, we will have a few more volunteers!

Also for your information, if you have an emergency plumbing leak in your home you had better know how to turn off the water shut-off valve (which is located outside). Some of the water shut-off valves in the Park are rusted so badly they will not turn. Find out where your valve is, and make sure it is in working order!! If it needs to be replaced the Park maintenance staff will change it.
