MILLENNIUM MEMO

Many of you have met Rosie Friedland of SPARC, our resident services entity. Rosie found many of the resources and programs SPARC has brought to The Tropics, attended countless Tropics events and helped several Tropics residents on a one-on-one basis.

It is my sad duty, therefore, to report that Rosie has resigned her position with SPARC. No, it wasn't something you said; she's leaving to spend more time with her family.

Nicki Ross, who runs SPARC and took care of The Topics prior to Rosie's arrival, will take on The Tropics again, so you're still in good hands. However, we will miss Rosie and remember her fondly.

In Happier News...

We had a great meeting with the Residents Club Board on October 6. In addition to the usual suspects, we had some guest celebrities: Tony Acosta, City Manager; Lt. Jeff Snell from the Police Department; and Alan Evans, a Fire Official.

The Police & Fire folks were invited to offer input on such topics as speeding, security and whether speed bumps hurt emergency response. Here are some highlights from the meeting:

- Per Lt. Snell, The Tropics is as safe as anywhere else in Union City and has not been a headache for the Police Dept. He pledged his Dept.'s full cooperation with our Staff and will research ways Police can do more patrolling inside the Park.
- The Fire folks don't like speed bumps, which reduce response time and damage fire trucks. Over the past 18 months the Fire Dept. responded to 274 medically-related incidents and 30 cases of serious falls. That's a visit about once every 3 days.
- At the request of the Board, we will obtain bids for a 24-hour Patrol Service. That will be expensive but it might be something worth discussing.
- The Car Wash will be closed. I'm not sure why it's still operating but the City's drought regulations don't allow us to keep it open.
- Karen Shrum, the Tropics' property supervisor, will conduct Parkwide space-by-space inspections in November and issue notices to homesites not in compliance. Consider yourself warned!

- Karen will also review bids to upgrade the pathway lighting, redo wiring & add lights between Hawaii & Palm, an area that currently doesn't have any lighting.
- The big \$855,000 street project should be done by the time you read this—at which time every street in The Tropics will have been replaced. Next up: \$122,000 to revamp the Pool Area landscaping.

I hope that gives you a flavor of what we talked about. I'll have more for you next month.





September and October have been exciting months for emergency preparedness here in The Tropics Mobile Home Park. Every emergency station is required to be tested frequently. This has two purposes. First of all when a major catastrophe occurs here in our community we are ready to activate immediately with currently up to date equipment.

Secondly how far can our distress call be heard?

Our station is among the top in the nation. We are linked with other transmitters worldwide which have been sending messages back to our park. All 50 states as well as 56 countries responded to our calls.

Convoy on the Air is a group of moving military vehicles testing and relaying to all the alert stations. They have been traveling throughout our country for the past two months.

The Tropics is one of the daily transmitting points recognized by thousands of stations. We will not be alone and forgotten.

Our special event K2E has been transmitting from the USS Hornet Aircraft Carrier 4 consecutive Sundays. Tina and I are the exclusively appointed FCC certified controllers for the entire west coast.

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR

Born Larry Cornell in Oakland, CA. He entered the Navy just 2 1/2 months after turning 17, making him a "kiddie cruiser". He served aboard a ship that tested atomic energy. He was what was called an "atomic vet". He served during the last part of testing of Dominic 2 at Johnson Island in the Pacific. He witnessed 18 of the 22 tests that were conducted while he was aboard.

One story Larry told me was about the first test he saw...it was midnight. They were all sitting on the flight deck. The sky was pitch black. The ship was tied up by the coral reef. All the workers had already been evacuated from Johnson Island. They were told that there weren't enough infrared glasses to go around. They were told to put their head between their legs and cover their face with their arms. After it goes off gradually start looking downward until you get adjusted to the light because when it goes off it is instantly brighter than any daylight you've ever seen. Larry said "I looked too soon cause I was young (17) and didn't believe it". His eyes got burned and he had to go to sickbay.

Larry was in the Navy for 3 years 10 months and 11 days. Shortly before he was discharged he was married.

The newlyweds then returned to San Leandro to settle down and raise a family.

During this time Larry worked for Chrysler Parts Depot until 1983 when the Depot closed and moved to Ontario. He decided to stay in San Leandro for his family and opened his own Automotive Repair shop. After 2 decades Larry sold his business and moved to the Tropics.

Once here he became involved with the computer club. At that time it was meeting once a month. Now it's open 5 days a week for 4 1/2 hours each day. "It's grown to be a big thing with donations. We do a lot of stuff. A lot of people think I get paid, I don't. It's something I enjoy."

Larry is now President of the Tropics Residents Club Board.
