MILLENNIUM MEMO

Before you flood me with emails, let me loudly state that Millennium is NOT responsible for the insert in last month's Breeze. Bessire & Casenhiser, The Tropics' Management Company, came up with that flyer. I guess they really don't like AB 1269!

Don't worry--after my recent chat with them, it will never happen again—right, B & C? As mentioned in last month's Notes from the Editor, political inserts aren't allowed, so we're very sorry this happened.

In case you're interested...AB 1269 would give the State the power to investigate and negotiate disputes between residents & management and perhaps (it's not clear yet) impose fines. It also would assess a \$5 annual charge per space, which could be passed on to residents. The bill is sponsored by GSMOL.

GSMOL would say that this creates a new tool for residents to pursue their complaints. Opponents argue that this is an unnecessary State overreach and that the \$5 fee will only get larger over time. As I noted, Millennium did not authorize that flyer and is not taking a position on this bill. I just wanted you to know that It Wasn't Us!

In More Relevant News...

By the time you read this, we should have completed the \$100K drainage repair on Palm Dr. For that cost, we better not see any more flooding! We also spent considerable money cutting ivy & trimming the Palm Trees. Don't the trees look great?

• Some upcoming projects: yet more pathway lighting, this time near Hawaii/ Oahu; \$8,500 to fix the Clubhouse Skylights; new Dog Waste Stations (\$1,700); and new Cyclone Fencing along the creek (\$7,000). Your Rent Dollars at Work!

We're off to a pretty good start with the Annual Income Certs: 387 of you have returned your Certs at last count. If you're one of the 157 tardy ones, please get your Cert in as soon as you can. You're going to have to do it eventually...

• The Food Bank continues to do well. 35-40 folks are regularly served, helped by our great volunteers. Kathy delivers food to an additional 12-14 folks who can't make it in person. This program is available on the 1st & 3rd Fridays of each month. Thanks to SPARC, our resident services partner, for bringing this great resource to The Tropics.


